There was dance, storytelling and music. Everyone enjoyed a bush walk and learnt about gathering bush food and how to be careful of some bush animals. It was a time for us to appreciate nature.

It was the first time for many of the families to experience the Australian bush. We shared our own life stories, faith stories and the similarities that exist between faiths. In the evening we shared a multicultural meal followed by dance and Karaoke. And lastly on Sunday we gathered for a multi-faith service.

Aboriginal Youth and Arts Program

Work has begun on what will be a stunning mural in Mirrabooka. The project is part of a partnership between the Edmund Rice Centre WA and the City of Stirling and is expected to be completed by January or February 2018.

The mural will depict a Noongar Six Seasons design onto the change rooms at the popular Fragrant Gardens Reserve.
